The Peabody Pre-Conservatory Violin Program, which was founded by Rebecca Henry in 2007 and is subsidized by the Dorothy Richard Starling Foundation, is comprised of gifted, advanced teenage violinists who study at the Peabody Preparatory. Many of these students also participate in Performance Academy Chamber Music and in the Peabody Youth Orchestra.

These young artists are challenged in a motivating environment that includes solo and ensemble work, guest master classes, rehearsal time with a professional pianist, conservatory audition preparation, and numerous performing opportunities. Members of the PCVP have won regional competitions and have performed as soloists with the National Philharmonic, Columbia Orchestra, Frederick Symphony, Landon Symphonette and at the Kennedy Center. The PCVP has performed regionally and with the Mid-Atlantic Symphony Orchestra, at the Music Institute of Chicago, Northwestern University, the Kennedy Center Millennium Stage Series in Washington, D.C. and in Bryant Park, New York City. In 2015 they shared in an exchange program with The Colburn School in Los Angeles, and are delighted to be visiting Duke University String School this spring.
